2008 February (1.5 years)

- Beds producing well, mixed cropping
- Looks great and producing where there was bare, wasted ground before.

June 2007, dry season

- Construction phase – pathways defined for walking – Beds filled with organic matter



# Thyolo, Thunga Primary School

2007 June, Construction Phase

- Previously swept bare, now filling beds with organic matter and digging water harvesting pits in preparation for the rains



# Thyolo, Thunga Primary School

2008 February – water harvesting

- Every corner of the school has a water harvesting design - banana plants surround the edges of the pits with many other appropriate species inter-mingled.

# Mulanje, CAP School


## the planning & construction phases
